## On-Going

Here's a block-by-block breakdown of the work currently underway:

- **Lees Avenue to Hazel Street:** Gas main installation and relocation of telecommunication cables;
- **Hazel Street to Riverdale Avenue:** Relocation of telecommunication cables; and,
- **Riverdale Avenue to the Rideau River:** Sanitary sewer installation and preparatory work for the up-coming watermain replacement.

## Upcoming

Here are key new upcoming construction activities planned for the next two weeks:

- **Hawthorne Avenue and Main Street Intersection:** Watermain installation;
- **Hawthorne Avenue to Lees Avenue:** Relocation of telecommunication cables;
- **Hazel Street to Clegg Street:** Removal of temporary sidewalk and Silva Cells installation;
- **Clegg Street to the Rideau River:** Removal of asphalt and concrete road base;
- **Brantwood Place Gates:** Removal of stone facing; and,
- **Rideau River Drive:** Installation of temporary water services.

## Traffic

### Main Street

- The northbound lane from Hawthorne Avenue to Harvey Street will be closed starting on April 7<sup>th</sup> until August 2016.
- The northbound lane from Clegg Street to Lees Avenue will remain closed until September 2016.
- The northbound lane from Riverdale Avenue to Clegg Street will be closed from tentatively May 2<sup>nd</sup> to November 2016.
- Starting in the next few weeks, the traffic south of Clegg Street will be reduced to one lane in each direction and will be moved to the east side of Main Street.

### Colonel By Drive

The Alive to Strive Race will take place on Sunday April 24<sup>th</sup>. For this event, **Colonel By Drive will be closed to traffic from Hog's Back Road to Clegg Street from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.**
