On-Going

Here's a block-by-block breakdown of the work currently underway:

• Clegg Street to the McIlraith Bridge: Placement of the concrete curbs and sidewalk, electrical work, road work, paving and landscaping.

Upcoming

Here are key <u>new</u> upcoming construction activities planned for the next two weeks:

- Harvey Street to Clegg Street: Installation of recycling units, tree guards and tree grates;
- Clegg Street to the McIlraith Bridge: Installation of regulatory signs and line painting, and;
- **Rideau River Drive:** Line painting.

Did you know?


Cycle tracks were covered in previous Newsletters but since they are relatively new in Ottawa, here is a refresher of important rules for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians:

- ✓ The cycle tracks are uni-directional (one-way), meaning that a cyclist cannot go north and south on the same track. As usual, cyclists must ride on the right side of the road. Follow the arrows!
- ✓ Cyclists must stay clear of the sidewalk and pedestrians must stay clear of the cycle tracks.
- ✓ Cyclists must yield to passengers loading and unloading from the bus. Zigzag lines on the cycle track alert cyclists of the bus stop locations.



- Turning motorists must yield to cyclists who are going straight ahead at intersections. Crossrides alert motorists to yield to cyclists. Crossrides are painted green and have small painted white squares called "elephant feet" on each side. Drivers must always check backwards over their right shoulder before turning right anywhere along the street.
- ✓ Bike boxes are provided at intersections to provide space for cyclists waiting at a red light. Take a look at these two short videos to see how to use them!
