- the community association was also made aware of concerns for a tree close to the $\underline{41 \text{ Concord St}}$ <u>N</u> development; we assisted by providing City forester contacts and a member of our planning committee (who lives in the neighbourhood) tried to facilitate a conversation of neighbours

Traffic / safety concerns

- also further to our discussion at the last Board meeting, we sent a message to our Councillor on February 21 re pedestrian & bike safety at the Main St / Riverdale intersection

- we had good news when our Councillor responded on February 28 as follows:

"I have received a response from the city's traffic department that they are indeed prepared to do a review of the Main Street's performance and safety this spring. At this time, I do not have details regarding methodology and timing, but I will follow up on this and find ways to involve the community in this process. The points raised by Don and a few others make a great place to start."
